How I Landed

After almost 10 months on the bench, I accepted a very good offer from Tek Systems to consult 12+ months at Bank of America (BofA) in Christina, DE, which for me is not a bad commute. Some remote work (from home) is a possibility, too. Let me recap both the long and the short of this job search adventure.

The Long: I posted my resume many places: job sites, corporate sites, consulting company sites, Craig's List. I rotated the version on display periodically. I used various job search agents on many sites including job, professional society, school, and target firms sites. I used secondary search engines like LinkedIn Jobs, SimplyHired and Indeed.com. I filtered for new jobs only, and developed a huge boolean search expression with primary skills and negatives for common disqualifiers. According to my Excel tracking spreadsheet, I applied to more than 220 job postings. I found the spreadsheet column 'date applied' is very important, as so many jobs seem the same, but recruiters seemed sure the new application was to a different posting if the other application was old enough.

<u>**The Short:</u>** I was adopted by a Tek Systems recruiter, Katie Daniel, who I met back in October. She</u> was impressed with what I had to offer despite my age and irregular history, so she gave me a preliminary short get-to-see-you interview. She kept me in mind, and found this BofA job before it hit the boards. I seemed a very good fit for this job, except some skills were over a decade out of use. I got a short phone interview with the hiring manager, then a longer phone tech interview with more than one interviewer in a conference call. and the next day an offer. This is a w2 consult, where I am a TEK Systems employee in the BofA shop.

My ability to *build a warm, confident rapport with the recruiter and manager* were undoubtedly very important. You have to proceed as if *all your contacts are critically important and golden,* and eventually, some of them are.

Then Dawn Lennon, President of Big Picture Consulting (located in the Lehigh Valley area), spoke to the membership about "Business Fitness: Smart Moves For Career Success".
